Lucas SITHOLE (1931-1994)

Some comments about the rarity of his works affecting prices

In 1962, Maj. Aubrey Fielding made the following comments on the invitation card to the exhibition "Township Life as seen by three Africans" (Louis Maqhubela, Gerard Sekoto, Lucas SITHOLE) held at the Adler Fielding Galleries, Johannesburg, which opened on 8th March, 1962:

"The third artist is the young sculptor Lucas SITHOLE. Here again, his works have proved so popular that he is unable to turn out enough. He is one of the very few carvers in the Transvaal and there is literally a waiting list for his carvings in wood".
